





## GENERAL INFORMATION

### The Purpose of the Conference

The Ninth Circuit Judicial Conference meets annually pursuant to Section 333 of Title 28 of the United States Code:

The chief judge of each circuit may summon biennially, and may summon annually, the circuit, district and bankruptcy judges of the circuit, in active service, to a conference at a time and place that he designates, for the purpose of considering the business of the courts and advising means of improving the administration of justice within such circuit. Every judge summoned may attend.

The court of appeals for each circuit shall provide by its rules for representation and active participation at such conference by members of the bar of such circuit. The Order of the Judicial Council of the Ninth Circuit sets forth three purposes of the conference:

To consider the business of the courts in the Ninth Circuit.

To advise means of improving the administration of justice in the Ninth Circuit.

To assist in implementing decisions made by competent authority as to the administration of the business of the courts in the Ninth Circuit.

The names of the Judicial Council members are listed in the Appendix. All conference members are expected to participate actively in the business of the conference.

### Organization of the Conference

The governing body of the conference is the Conference Executive Committee, consisting of elected representatives from each group comprising the conference. The current members are listed in the Appendix.

### Program for Spouses and Guests

Various activities described on pages 18-21 are be available for spouses and families. Spouses and conference guests are cordially invited to attend all general sessions except for *Breakfast with the Bench* because of space restrictions.

## The Composition of the Conference

The conference is composed of circuit, district, bankruptcy, and magistrate judges of the circuit, circuit, district and bankruptcy court clerks, together with the Lawyer Representatives Coordinating Committee (LRCC), lawyer representatives, the Advisory Board, United States attorneys, federal public defenders, chief pretrial services and chief probation officers.



**The CSI Effect: From the Living Room to the Courtroom**

**District Judge William Alsup** was appointed to the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of California on August 17, 1999. Prior to his appointment, he engaged in private practice at Morrison & Foerster from 1980 to 1999 and from 1973 to 1978. He was a special trial counsel, Antitrust Division, U.S. Department of Justice, in 1998 and was an assistant to the U.S. solicitor general from 1978 to 1980. Judge Alsup received his B.S. from Mississippi State University in 1967, his J.D. from Harvard University in 1971, and his M.P.P. from Harvard University, John F. Kennedy School of Government, in 1971. Following law school, he clerked for Associate Justice William O. Douglas of the U.S. Supreme Court from 1971 to 1972. He maintains chambers in San Francisco.



**Circuit Judge Consuelo M. Callahan** was appointed to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit on May 28, 2003. From 1996 to 2003, she was an associate justice, for the California State Court of Appeal, and served as a California Superior Court judge in San Joaquin County from 1992 to 1996. Judge Callahan received her A.B. from Stanford University in 1972 and her J.D. from the University of the Pacific, McGeorge School of Law, in 1975. She maintains chambers in Sacramento.



**Lyle Carlile** is director, Branch of Fire Management, Bureau of Indian Affairs, National Interagency Fire Center in Boise, Idaho. He has been involved in fire suppression and prescribed fire throughout his career, which began in 1983 with the Bureau of Indian Affairs in the forest development section of the Branch of Forestry in San Carlos, Arizona. In 1982, Mr. Carlile earned a B.S. degree in forest management from Oklahoma State University and attended TREES VIII (Tri-Regional Education in Ecology and Silviculture) in 1989 and 1990 and became a certified silviculturist in 1990. He is an enrolled member of the Cherokee Nation of Oklahoma.



**Cathy A. Catterson** was appointed the circuit and court of appeals executive for the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit on December 5, 2007. Previously, Ms. Catterson served as chief deputy clerk prior to her appointment as clerk in 1985. She also was a law clerk to District Judge Edward J. Devitt of the District of Minnesota from 1977 to 1979. In that capacity, Ms. Catterson provided staff support to the JCUS Committee on

Attorney Admission Standards. Ms. Catterson also served as legislative secretary/staff assistant to U.S. Senator Jacob K. Javits from 1971 to 1977. Ms. Catterson has served on numerous national committees involving federal appellate court administration and as a consultant in judicial administration, to the Supreme Courts of Israel, India, Guam, and Thailand, as well as the European Court for Human Rights. She graduated from the Catholic University of America and received her J.D. degree from George Mason University.



**Paul D. Clement** served until recently as the 43rd solicitor general of the United States. He is currently a visiting professor at the Georgetown University Law Center and a senior fellow at the center's Supreme Court Institute. He received his bachelor's degree summa cum laude from the Georgetown University School of Foreign Service, and his master's degree from Cambridge University. He graduated magna cum laude

from Harvard Law School where he was the Supreme Court editor of the Harvard Law Review. Following graduation, Mr. Clement clerked for Judge Laurence H. Silberman of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit, and for Associate Justice Antonin Scalia of the U.S. Supreme Court. After his clerkships, he served as chief counsel of the U.S. Senate Subcommittee on the Constitution, Federalism and Property Rights and then was a partner in the Washington, D.C., office of King & Spalding, where he headed the firm's appellate practice. Mr. Clement joined the Department of Justice in 2001. Before his confirmation as solicitor general, he served as acting solicitor general for nearly a year and as principal deputy solicitor general. He has argued 49 cases before the U.S. Supreme Court.



**Circuit Judge Richard R. Clifton** was appointed to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit on July 18, 2002. Prior to his appointment, he engaged in private practice as a partner at Cades, Schutte, Fleming & Wright in Honolulu from 1982 to 2002, and as an associate from 1977 to 1982. Judge Clifton received his A.B. from Princeton University in 1972 and his J.D. from Yale Law School in 1975. He clerked for Circuit Judge

Herbert Y.C. Choy of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit from 1975 to 1976, and was an adjunct professor at the University of Hawaii, William S. Richardson School of Law, from 1978 to 1980, and from 1983 to 1989. Judge Clifton is chair of the Conference Executive Committee. He maintains chambers in Honolulu.



**Steve Cochran** is a partner of Katten Muchin Rosenman in Los Angeles. He has extensive experience litigating business disputes about intellectual property, employment, defamation, real estate and contracts. Mr. Cochran also defends clients facing criminal prosecution in state and federal courts. **Walter Dellinger** is chair of the appellate practice at O'Melveny and Myers and is the Douglas B. Maggs Professor of Law at Duke University. He served as acting solicitor general for the 1996-97 term of the Supreme Court. During that time, he argued nine cases before the court, the most by any solicitor general in more than 20 years. He is currently serving as special counsel to the board of directors of the New York Stock

lectured throughout the United States in programs sponsored by the American Bar Association, Practising Law Institute and numerous other organizations.





He was in private practice in San Francisco, California from 1961 to 1963, as well as in Sacramento, California, from 1963 to 1975. From 1965 to 1988, he was a professor of constitutional law at the McGeorge School of Law, University of the Pacific. He has served in numerous positions during his career, including a member of the California Army National Guard in 1961, the board of the Federal Judicial Center from 1987 to 1988, and two JCUS committees: the Advisory Panel on Financial Disclosure Reports and Judicial Activities, subsequently renamed the Advisory Committee on Codes of Conduct, from 1979 to 1987, and the Committee on Pacific Territories from 1979 to 1990, which he chaired from 1982 to 1990. He was appointed to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit in 1975. President Reagan nominated him as an associate justice of the Supreme Court, and he took his seat on February 18, 1988. **Chief Circuit Judge Alex Kozinski** was appointed United States Circuit Judge for the Ninth Circuit on November 7, 1985. He was elevated to chief judge of the circuit on November 30, 2007. He graduated from UCLA, receiving an A.B. degree in 1972, and from UCLA Law School, receiving a J.D. degree in 1975. Prior to his appointment to the appellate bench, Judge Kozinski served as Chief Judge of the United

States Claims Court, 1982-85; Special Counsel, Merit Systems Protection Board, 1981-82; Assistant Counsel, Office of Counsel to the President, 1981; Deputy Legal Counsel, Office of President-Elect Reagan, 1980-81; Attorney, Covington & Burling, 1979-81; Attorney, Forry Golbert Singer & Gelles, 1977-79; Law Clerk to Chief Justice Warren E. Burger, 1976-77; and Law Clerk to Circuit Judge Anthony M. Kennedy, 1975-76.



**Adam Liptak** is a national legal correspondent for The New York Times. His column on legal affairs, “Sidebar,” appears on Tuesdays. In the fall, he will become the paper’s Supreme Court reporter. Mr. Liptak has covered the Supreme Court nominations of John G. Roberts, Jr., and Samuel A. Alito, Jr.; the investigation into the disclosure of the identity of Valerie



His work has important implications on land management in fire prone ecosystems. He is author of “Land of Chamise and Pines: Historical Accounts and Current Status of Northern Baja California’s Vegetation” and “California’s Fading Wildflowers: Lost Legacy and Biological Invasions,” both published by the University of California press.



**Senior Circuit Judge Dorothy W. Nelson** was appointed to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit on December 20, 1979, and assumed senior status on January 1, 1995. Prior to her appointment, Judge Nelson was dean of the University of Southern California Law School from 1969 to 1980. She is chair of the Ninth Circuit’s Alternative Dispute Resolution Committee. She maintains chambers in Pasadena.



**Peter Neufeld** co-founded and co-directs The Innocence Project at the Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law. The project currently represents hundreds of inmates seeking post-conviction release through DNA testing. In its 15 years of existence, The Innocence Project has been responsible, in whole or in part, for exonerating most of the 216 men cleared through post-conviction DNA testing. In recent years, the project has

assumed a leadership role in the emerging civil rights movement to identify and address the systemic causes of wrongful conviction. Mr. Neufeld has litigated and lectured extensively in both the “hard” and behavioral forensic sciences. His trials frequently redefine and expand the parameters of permissible defenses involving forensic psychiatry and laboratory science. He graduated from the University of Wisconsin in 1972 and received his J.D. from New York University School of Law in 1975.



**Samuel N. Penney** is the chairman of the Nez Perce Tribal Executive Committee, the governing body of the Nez Perce Tribe. He was first elected to the Executive Committee in May 1989 and was re-elected to his seventh consecutive three-year term in May 2007. Chairman Penney has served 10 years as chairman of the Nez Perce Tribal Executive Committee and four years as vice chairman. He also has served as chairman of the

Law and Order/Intergovernmental Affairs Subcommittee and held numerous subcommittee assignments during his years on the Executive Committee. Chairman Penney has served as an advisory board member on the Federal Advisory Committee Act for hydroelectric re-licensing and presently serves on the tribal advisory boards to the presidents of Washington State University, University of Idaho and Lewis Clark State College. He also serves on the Albertson Minority Affairs Advisors for Albertson College of Idaho and is also a policy board member of the Portland State University, Hatfield School of Government, Institute for Tribal Government. Chairman Penney has been a guest speaker at many educational institutions including Harvard and Yale universities.



**Jeanne Pincha-Tulley** is the forest fire chief of Fire and Aviation Management on the Tahoe National Forest and is assigned to Team 3 as (Type 1 National) incident commander. She started her career on the Mount Baker-Snoqualmie National Forest as a seasonal fire fighter in 1978 while earning her forest management degree from the University of Washington. Ms. Pincha-Tulley received a permanent appointment in 1979 with

the Mt. Hood National Forest. She has worked on five national forests and two different regions throughout her career, gaining extensive experience in prescribed fire, aviation and suppression. His research focuses on empirical studies of the legal system, especially decision-making; the behavior of the litigation system; and the law's use of science.



**D. Bruce Sewell** is senior vice president and general counsel of Intel Corporation. His management responsibilities include legal, corporate affairs, and Intel's corporate social responsibility programs, which ensure Intel's positive worldwide impact on education, the environment and in our communities. As general counsel, he supervises a team of roughly 600 attorneys and policy professionals located in over 30 countries around

the world. Prior to joining Intel, Mr. Sewell was a partner with Brown and Bain PC where he handled such notable cases as the landmark dispute between Apple Computer and Microsoft Corporation over copyrightability of Macintosh's graphical user interface. He received his B.S. from the University of Lancaster in the United Kingdom in 1979 and his J.D. from George Washington University in 1986.



**Robert C. Shaler, Ph.D.**, is director of the Forensic Science Program at Pennsylvania State University. After earning his doctoral degree from Pennsylvania State University in 1968, he has had academic appointments at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine, the University of Pittsburgh School of Pharmacy, the City University of New York, and New York University School of Medicine. In 1978 he joined the staff of the

New York City Medical Examiner's Office as head of its serology laboratory, a position he held until 1987, when he moved to the Lifecodes Corporation, the nation's first forensic DNA typing laboratory. He introduced DNA fingerprinting to the nation's legal and law enforcement communities. In the wake of the terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center, he assumed responsibility for DNA identification efforts, designing the testing strategy and coordinating the work of six different laboratories. In 2005 he published a book, "Who They Were, Inside the World Trade Center DNA Story: The Unprecedented Effort to Identify the Missing," that told the story of people working behind the scenes of the DNA work done at the medical examiner's office in New York City.



**Helen Stacy**, over the last 25 years has been a solicitor, barrister, legal philosopher and law professor in Australia, England, Germany and the United States. She currently teaches and writes about international law, jurisprudence and human rights as a professor at Stanford Law School and is senior research scholar at the Freeman Spogli Institute for International Studies at Stanford. She is a member of Stanford's Center on

Democracy, Development and the Rule of Law, and a researcher with the Forum on Contemporary Europe. Before coming to Stanford, Professor Stacy taught at the faculty of law at Queensland University of Technology in Brisbane, Australia. He was note and comment editor of the Duke Law Journal and graduated Order of the Coif.



**Kathleen M. Sullivan** has 25 years of experience in appellate advocacy and 23 years of experience as a law professor at Harvard and Stanford law schools. She recently completed five years as dean of Stanford Law School. She remains a member of the Stanford Law School faculty as the Stanley Morrison Professor of Law and the head of Stanford's new Constitutional Law Center. 
## Additional Program Speakers


