Lloyd Miller is a partner with the Washington, D.C. based law firm of Sonosky, Chambers, Sachse, Endreson & Perry, LLP. The firm has five offices and Lloyd manages the Anchorage office. Over his career, Lloyd has worked extensively on tribal jurisdiction litigation (including trial and appellate litigation), alcohol and gaming regulation, Indian Self-Determination Act and “self-governance” matters, Indian health law issues, employment law, ANCSA land and corporate matters, land claims, government contracting law, Indian Child Welfare Act matters, Court of Federal Claims and Claims Court cases involving treaty rights, hunting and fishing cases, and a variety of general counsel matters for tribal governments, ANCSA corporations, and tribal health and social service providers. Lloyd serves by dual state and federal court appointment as Plaintiffs’ Liaison Counsel in the EXXON VALDEZ Oil Spill Litigation (also serving as co-class counsel to the Alaska Native Class). In 2005, Lloyd successfully argued *Cherokee Nation v. Leavitt*, 543 U.S. 631 (2005) and since that time has continued to be heavily involved in class action and individual litigation for Tribes suing the government over contracts awarded under the Indian Self-Determination Act. In addition to litigation, Lloyd’s work involves extensive administrative, regulatory and lobbying practice.

Lloyd received his B.A. from Yale in 1975 and graduated with honors from the University of Virginia Law School in 1978, where he received the Order of the Coif. After graduation he interned for one year with Chief Judge James M. Fitzgerald of the United States District Court for the District of Alaska. His Bar admissions include the Alaska Bar, 1978; District of Columbia Bar, 1979; U.S. Supreme Court, 1984; U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit, 1980; U.S. Court of Appeals for the 9th Circuit, 1996; U.S. Court of Appeals for the 10th Circuit, 1982; U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit, 1999; U.S. Court of Federal Claims, 1979; U.S. District

Court for the District of Columbia, 1981; and the U.S. District Court for the District of Alaska, 1979.

Lloyd has long been active in the Federal Bar Association, has been an officer of the Alaska Chapter of the FBA, served for two years as Co-Chairperson for the national Annual Federal Indian Law Conference (1992 and 1993), and is presently the Treasurer of the FBA Indian Law Section. Lloyd also founded the Alaska Native Law Section of the Alaska Bar Association, and during his tenure as Chairman (1984-1993) helped organize over one dozen CLE programs on Native American legal issues. Also from 1984-1993, Lloyd served on the Board of the Alaska Legal Services Corporation in various officer positions (including President). Lloyd is currently one of four Lawyer Representatives from the District of Alaska to the Ninth Circuit (2004-2007).

In 2006, Lloyd led a collaborative effort with the Federal Bar Association and the Alaska Bar Association to organize an appellate advocacy CLE program introduced by General William Suter, Clerk of the United States Supreme Court, and led by four Ninth Circuit Court judges, two Alaska appellate judges, and a former Solicitor General to the United States.

Lloyd is married to Heather Kendall-Miller, a senior attorney with the Native American Rights Fund. They have two daughters, Asha and Ruth, and one granddaughter, Shoshone.
